John was formerly the President of the International Institute for Restorative Practices Graduate School (IIRP).

After devoting two years to the Moravian Theological Seminary, he earned his master's degree from the IIRP Graduate School and a Ph.D. in Education with a specialization in Adult Learning, from Lesley University. Lynne is founder and executive director for Restoration Matters, a nonprofit dedicated to virtue literacy and restorative practices located in St. Louis, Missouri. She promotes restorative practices in business, school, and community organizations by evaluating policies and procedures, then training staff to cultivate quality relationships and transform conflict at all levels.

She holds Masters Degrees in both Health Management and in Restorative Practices. Lynne is a certified instructor and coach for IIRP and developed Virtue-Based Restorative Discipline (VBRD), a Catholic response to bullying behaviors in 2010.

She worked for the Archdiocese of St. Louis from 2011-2018 and for a large health care network Health System developing health curriculum from 1998-2011. Lynne is a published author, trainer, and international speaker in restorative practices with an emphasis on safety and violence prevention through relational skills. She holds trainings nationwide each year to support schools in implementing systemic changes to improve school culture through virtue literacy and restorative practices.

Lynne recently developed a social-emotional curriculum, PRAISES, for the Diocese of Wichita Kansas Catholic schools. Dr. Frida Rundell assisted in developing the two-year research study that showed an increase in empathy and a more positive school culture. This middle school model is recommended to be delivered first to staff, then middle school students learn social competencies and they develop lessons for younger grades. The outcomes of the research became the foundation of a training project for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania funded by the Ambassador's Fund for Catholic Education.
